

- -1,920 people were shown that they are valuable

- -1,920 people learned how to live jigger free forever.
- -1,920 people now have the chance to live healthy & productive lives
- -5,199 pairs of shoes were made.

Other diseases were treated: 60 cases of Malaria, 6 cases of Bacterial Diarrhea, 30 cases of Skin Infections, 4 cases of Malnutrition, 2 cases of Anemia, 15 Respiratory tract infections, 5 Urinary tract infections, 4 cases of Measles, 5 cases of HIV/AIDS, 6 cases of Hypertension, 9 cases of Epilepsy were diagnosed and connected to local resources.



### Lyn's Line or So....Kathryn (Kathy) Ersland 1936

Born: Family Farm in Gilby Township, ND. Youngest of 6 children

**Parents:** Das was a wheat and potato farmer. Mom helped on the farm, raised kids, mowed the old fashioned way and had a big garden. We had cows, pigs, chickens, family dog and farm cats. No pets in the house.

**Baptized and Confirmed**: St. Paul Lutheran Church, Honeyford, ND, population 30. (less people know). The minister had 4 county churches so services were every other week and communion was once a year. (don't recall which Sunday).

**School**: Country School, District 36 until 8th grade, 9 through 12, Grand Forks Central, ND. Stayed with an aunt who lived 25 miles away and took the train home on weekends.

**Activities**: Choir, 4H (county president), LDR (Lutheran Daughters of Reformation), Rainbow (sponsored by the Eastern Star). Also drove the wheat truck for her dad in the summer.

**College:** Concordia-Moorhead approximately 100 miles south of home. Graduated in 1958 majoring in Education and Domestic Science (Home Ec.)

**Kenyon Connection**: None, didn't want to teach in the big city. Had a sister in the Twin Cities. Lived with Lola Erickson, High School Librarian above the Strandemo house on Forest Street for \$20 a month each.

**Left Town**: Became a County Extension Agent in Wilken County, Breckenridge, MN **Marriage**: Bob worked on her 1954 Ford Fairland at Glen Broin's Texaco Station, Kenyon. It's a sweet and personal love story. They were married in a private ceremony in Sisseton, SD in the fall of 1960.

**Children**: Two step daughters, Linda a retired nurse at St. Mary's (dialysis). LaVae, retired from the IRS. Pete, born in the fall of 1961, married, Littleton, MA, computer chip Engineer, two children. Becky, 1962 (lost husband Keith, 54, two years ago, he suffered a massive heart attack while hunting), 3 children and 3 great grandkids, she teaches 1st grade in Arlington, SD. Tom, 1963, married and works at Maple Island, Wanamingo as a trainer, various part-time jobs, two children and 4 great grandkids.

**Employment:** In those days (Harapat era) teachers couldn't be pregnant and teach. That took care of that. Until the 70's was a part time substitute at KHS. Bob rented from Amos Stolee, after 4 years he bought the farm and in 1973 Maus and Buckingham built their home, where they still reside today. Bob & Kathy were school bus drivers for many years. Kathy was Don Gifford's (Bonnie Rapp's father) substitute mail route carrier and went full time in 1982 until 2000.

Why First Lutheran?: Oscar Jorstad Sr. asked them to join in 1961. Faithful members since. Church Duties: Many committees, too many to name. Ladies Aid, at the time, almost 60 years ago there were 12 Bible studies, now we are down to one. Sunday School and Bible School teacher, washing dishes at funerals, setting up for communion with Sharon Rechtzigel, also Thanksgiving Décor with Deb Maki and John & Lila Cole.

**Retirement:** I was told you are going to be bored. It's been 18 years and I am not bored yet. I love to read and study the Bible and my granddaughter says I make great cookies.

**Hymn"s:** It's like picking a favorite child. I like some new ones like "Eagle's Wings" and "Borning Cry". Love the classics "Beautiful Savior" and "Sweet Hour of Prayer".

Kathy told me a cute story. In her youth at church she told her brother "I'm the only one I can hear singing" her brother said "Well then, don't sing so loud".

We concluded our visit as Kathy is convalescing at the Sunset Home. I told her I wasn't familiar with the song "How Lovely are Thy Dwellings". Without missing a beat, she sang that song to me as a college girl would so long ago, it brought a tear to my eye. Kathy, my friend, you still got "IT".
