Rob and Tara are the directors of the ministry called Community Cloud Forest Conservation. Rob has big issues with ice cream. He has been known to jump off the moving bus to purchase ice cream for a group. This year we stopped at the usual ice cream stop on the way from Guatemala City to Coban. I chose a cup of mango ice cream. Mmmm yummy!

A few days later we were making another ice cream stop. Rob announced you can get ice cream, but it must be in a sugar cone. Ugh, I thought, I like mine in a cup. Why a sugar cone? Well because there is no plastic to throw into the trash.

In July I met with the good people who set up communion. We had a meaningful discussion about recycling. There are things we recycle that don't belong in the recycling that clog up the machines. The news that China is no longer taking our recycling. Rob's comment about sugar cones stretch me in new ways concerning plastic and compassion for the Earth.

My stretch since coming home from Guatemala is to be more mindful of limiting my consumption of plastic. It is hard to do! Even when I went to put my recent purchase of an ice coffee container in the garbage, I woke up to the truth it came in a plastic container with a plastic straw.

The Psalmist proclaims in chapter 65, "You care for the land and water it; you enrich it abundantly. The streams of God are filled with water to provide the people with grain, for so you have ordained it. You drench its furrows and level its ridges; you soften it with showers and bless its crops. You crown the year with your bounty, and your carts overflow with abundance. The grasslands of the desert overflow; the hills are clothed with gladness. The meadows are covered with flocks and the valleys are mantled with grain; they shout for joy and sing."

We know this right?! I am challenging and stretching myself even more to see the beauty of God's creation by showing more compassion in the choices I make. Will you join me?

Small Wonders

"Blue Butterflies" is the title of a pretty little piece of music found in an old piano lesson book (c.1955). When I play it, I wonder what the composer meant to express. Imagine my surprise, when not long afterward, blue butterflies came to our yard to feed on white clover. This prompted a Google Search—offering this question/answer: "What does it mean when you see a blue butterfly?" 
